#### 6.1 Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage – Request to Present

WALGA has been supporting the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage in the final stages of consultation that will support the implementation of the Heritage Act 2018. This process will take submissions on an initial set of regulations to accompany the Act; develop guidelines for local heritage surveys; and seek expressions of interest for a new Heritage Council, which will be appointed once the new Act is proclaimed. Local government input to the consultation process is strongly encouraged, with submissions taken until mid-April. Following the consultation process, the Department has offered to give a short presentation to each Zone noting highlights of the new Act of relevance to Local Government, and identifying further opportunities for training and information.

- ii) two members of the public who are not members of any government–appointed committee or community lobby group

to become members of the Local Government Act Review Reference Group, and

iii) when the Reference Group's process is finalised and legislation is drafted, that the draft legislation be referred to a Parliamentary Committee to allow public hearings and input into the proposed legislation.

The Central Metropolitan Zone urges WALGA to undertake a review to understand why there is emerging concerns about the structure of WALGA, the decision making process including the voting structure at State Council, and all other matters necessary to address any systematic problems which, if left unchecked, can undermine the association.
