6. BUSINESS

6.1 Local Government Disability Access and Inclusion Groups

Town of Victoria Park

Background

The *Disability Services Act 1993* (amended 2004) requires state government agencies and local government authorities to develop and implement a Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP). DAIPs provide a significant mechanism to assist public authorities to identify and remove barriers to people with disability in their services, events, information, buildings and facilities, consultation and complaints processes and employment.

WALGA currently has an access and inclusion networking group for officers which meet quarterly. However, local government advisory groups are currently not invited to participate in this networking. My intention is to expand the current quarterly meeting format to include LG disability advisory groups. Many members on these advisory groups have personal experience living with a disability, have a family member with a disability or are carers.

The following motion was endorsed by the Town of Victoria Park at their 19 March 2019 Council Meeting:

That Council puts forward a motion to the WALGA Southeast Metropolitan Zone meeting, through its appointed delegates, to invite Local Government access and inclusion advisory group members to attend the quarterly Access and Inclusion Network Group meetings.

What is a mutual and how is it different to traditional transactional insurance providers? This presentation will include the history of LGIS, organisation structure, relationship with WALGA and provide examples of service delivery – highlighting the benefits of membership.

• Know your risks - identifying and managing local government risks

The risks faced by Local Governments across WA continue to change. In this presentation
LGIS risk experts will outline the strategies which can be used by Local Governments to
strategically identify and manage risks. They'll also talk about the experiences of other WA
Local Government members in identifying and managing their risks.

The human factor – emerging risks for 2019 and beyond

People are a crucial success factor for Local Government organisations they're the human face of Local Government services. In this presentation LGIS human risk experts will discuss the emerging trends in managing people from the diverse needs of an aging workforce to increases in workplace stress. They'll use real examples from WA Local Governments to explore potential strategies in managing and reducing human risks.

Elected members – managing risks and protection

Elected members are passionate about improving their community, going above and beyond in their service. However, as part of their role elected members also carry significant risks which they need to be aware of. In this presentation an LGIS Local Government risk expert will cover the risks which elected members must be aware of and manage, and the services and cover included in LGIS membership. They'll use real examples from WA Local Governments to explore strategies in managing and reducing elected member risks.

Local government first – a claims strategy that benefits LGIS members

How does LGIS handle claims differently? When LGIS receives a claim we consider the best interest of the member and the broader Local Government sector. This presentation outlines the LGIS claims strategy which plans for long term, sustainable protection of the WA Local Government sector. We'll look at a variety of WA Local Government claims and explore the lessons learned.

6.3 Late Item – Training Course In Heritage

RECOMMENDATION

That WALGA investigates the potential for establishing a training course in heritage which would provide a formal qualification or accreditation for those who complete the course.

BACKGROUND

Currently, there is no course available which provides a qualification or accreditation in heritage. Our history and heritage is a significant issue for local government, and, consequently, such a course is likely to be valuable for the sector and those working in it. This motion asks WALGA to investigate the potential for establishing such a course, either through WALGA or another training provider.

SECRETARIAT COMMENT

Currently there is a qualification in place at the University of WA which delivers a **Graduate Certificate** in Heritage Studies Graduate Certificate in Heritage Studies

Additionally there are various opportunities for Heritage training listed through the <u>State Heritage Council</u> WALGA Training has not received any other enquiries about Heritage training to date.

The current Local Government Training Package only contains 2 units of competence that mention heritage. There is currently a review process in train that will be open for sector input shortly. WALGA will ensure that Local Governments and Elected Members receive a link to the feedback for the Local Government Training Package, where input can be provided around the need for heritage qualifications at a VET level.
